<p>RECOMMENDS the ALive Secretariat and the World Bank to start organizing the Training of Trainers Workshop and to support the uptake of the Toolkit</p>	<p>Training organized report to be made by the World bank</p>
<p>RECOMMENDS the ALive Secretariat to consider the inclusion in the current Triennial Action Plan of an activity aiming at catalyzing and leading a continental approach to collect, systematize and disseminate data on national African Animal Genetic Resources in their production, economic and agro-ecological systems in Coordination with FAO and its Domestic Animal diversity Information system DAD-IS and National Coordinators for Animal Genetic Resources;</p>	<p>One of the emergency issues in the call for proposal for the next rolling TAP will be on the Animal Genetic resources.</p>
<p>RECOMMENDS that ALive raises awareness of the need to match genotypes and production environment with the view to promote sustainable production systems and conserve livestock biodiversity</p>	<p>The criteria for selection will include these requirements</p>

- 28% not implemented
- 51% ongoing
- 18% Partially completed and
- 3% completed



# Livestock Portfolio Progress / improvements



- Designed a template that will facilitate data collection for all African countries rather than SSA as requested by the 16<sup>th</sup> Executive Committee in Bamako, 2010
- The data collection process entailed the capturing of National (1<sup>st</sup> level), then the RECs (2<sup>nd</sup> level) and the investors
- Refined and expanded the areas of interventions including the specific areas
- The coverage of the projects have been extended in an hierarchical manner from the National level down to the Locality level
- The data collection include Multi-lateral & Bi-lateral donors, private sector, and countries interventions



# Livestock Portfolio Progress / Challenges



- The search and capture of data becomes complex given the disaggregation and completeness of data available as well as the number of donors funding different activities .
- The process of populating the data base is time consuming and tedious (entails data mining and analyses), hence it may requires a staff devoted for.
- There is limited information in some countries and RECs
